

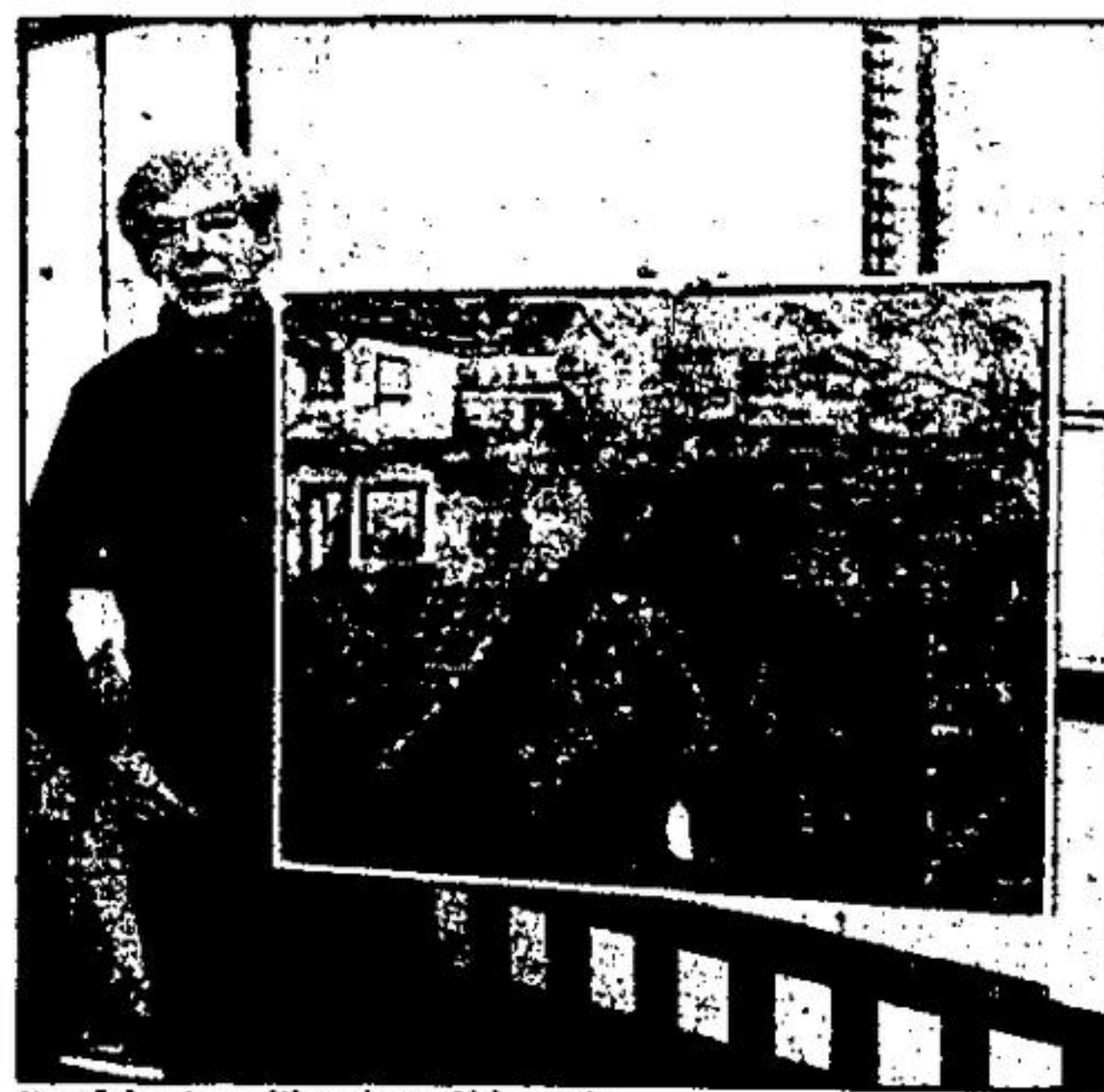
Penny-pinchers

Acton artist shows work

Don Johnston's artwork originates in his head. "I guess I just dream things up... I don't like the idea of photographic art, painting a scene in front of you," Johnston, an Acton area design-consultant, claims. Johnston has been taking his painting seriously for about the past 10 years, but he admits it is only in the last year that he has worked hard at developing his acrylic and watercolor themes into show material. This month his work is on display at Doodle's Restaurant in Rockwood. Don studied art and design at Central Tech in Toronto, then later at the Ontario College of Art. He spent 10 years working as a designer at CBC Television before starting his own consulting business, Design Enterprises Inc. He has won awards for his furniture designs, homes and interiors.

The pictures at Doodle's include some oriental-style modern watercolors and some 18th Century European street scenes, with old stone buildings, bridges, narrow cobblestone streets and period costumes. "The settings with buildings come naturally to me, I guess, with my background in architecture," he said. Johnston has lived in the Acton area for the past 14 years. His work will be on display at Doodle's until mid-March.

Police raid nets two films

Two hard-core pornographic films have been pulled off the shelves of video stores in Halton Hills, according to Staff Sergeant Boris Yacyshyn of the Halton Regional Police's Drug and Morality Squad. Reacting to complaints from two Georgetown women, morality officers raided five stores in Halton Hills and two in Milton looking for hard-core films being sold over the counter.

Police instructed distributors to send the hard-core films back to the manufacturer. They found two films in Burlington. The raid was part of a region-wide search for hard-core pornographic films which occurred last Wednesday and Thursday. "We covered all the stores in the region," stated Staff Sgt. Yacyshyn. "We didn't seize any of them, but we warned distributors that if we came back and the films were being sold, they would be charged." "Normally, the people who run these stores are cooperative because they don't want to go to court and possibly pay a fine," commented the staff sergeant.

Judge gives Dunn three month term

Over a year after having charged with trafficking in a narcotic, David Lawrence Dunn Ranson St. has been sentenced to three months in jail and put on two years' probation. Dunn was arrested in February, 1982 after a regionwide undercover investigation by RCMP and Halton Regional Police nabbed 30 men suspected for drug dealing.

Dunn plead guilty to the charge last month and was sentenced Friday by Judge James D. Carnwath. At the sentencing, Elizabeth Dunn, the accused's mother, told the judge from November, 1981 to February, 1982, a new friend of her son, Jerry, made frequent telephone calls to their home. At first they were two or three times a week, and by early February, the man made as many as three a night, and that was just during the hours she was home, she noted. Her son only returned the calls once. She learned later Jerry was an undercover officer.

Tammy Dunn, his sister, told Judge Carnwath she also answered the telephone three or

four times an evening and it was always the person known as Jerry. The telephone calls ceased when her brother was arrested, she said.

Dunn testified to the judge that he met Jerry in the 747 Restaurant in Acton in November, 1981. The officer told him he and his family had just moved to town and he wanted to get to know people. The two got together five or six times after that. Many times during their association, Jerry asked Dunn for some marijuana. After several requests, Dunn said, he finally decided to get some for his new friend.

On January 7, 1982, the two drove to Agnes St. in the officer's car, and Dunn went into a house. He returned to the car with \$330 worth of marijuana. Jerry weighed it on scales, and gave Dunn the money, who immediately returned to the house and handed over the money to another person.

Although Dunn never spoke to the officer after that day, the calls persisted until his arrest over a month later.
