Police beat

Rash of B & Es keep police busy

Halton Regional police responded to a rash of break-ins in the Acton area, with home and storeowners reporting a total of six successful break-ins and three attempted ones.

About \$700 in jewelry, coin sets and a pocket calculator were taken from a home on Division Street on the weekend. A real estate agent who had permission from the owner to show the residence Saturday discovered a broken window where thieves entered.

A window seven feet from the ground was forced open at Superior Glove Works on Vimy Street sometime between noon on Saturday and 9 a.m. on Sunday, police report. Three vending machines and a coin change box were damaged. Police say thieves used a shovel and a crow bar they found on the premises to pry open the coin boxes and take \$35 in coins. Damage is estimated at \$900.

About \$20 in cash was stolen from the Royal Canadian Legion early Monday morning by thieves who forced open the rear door.

Culprits smashed a basement window at a home on Roseford Terrace Thursday evening and took \$200 worth of jewelry.

A camera, a small amount of cash and jewelry worth \$140 were taken from a home on Longfield Road, sometime between 12.30 p.m. and 4 p.m. Tuesday afternoon.

Halton Regional police state that entry was gained by an insecure side door.

Residents at RR 2 Acton were home when thieves tried to break into the basement overnight Friday, police say. The basement window was broken, but no entry was gained.

At a neighboring home, at RR 2 Acton, a basement window was smashed at the same time, but no entry was gained. The residents were out at the time. On Saturday at 2.30 a.m.

thieves tore the screen in a basement bedroom window in an attempt to enter a house on Churchill Road South. Damage is estimated at \$20, but thieves did not get in.

A rock was thrown through a front window of a home on Cobblehill Road on 9.30 p.m. Saturday, police report. Damage is estimated at \$100.

A father and son were involved in a domestic dispute in a residence at RR 1, Acton at 10.20 p.m. Friday. There were no damages and no injuries.

Wilful damage was caused to L and L Ford sometime overnight Friday, Halton Regional Police report. The window in the front door was smashed. Damage to the window is about \$40.

A stop sign, worth \$50 was stolen from the corner of Highway 7 and First Line Saturday at midnight. Police report there were no accidents at the time. A 22-year-old Acton male

sustained a bruise to his forehead after being involved in a minor assault at 3 a.m. Saturday at a home on Mill Street East. There were no charges laid in the incident which involved another 22-year-old male.

Sometime overnight Saturday a red 1979 Honda motorcycle was stolen from the rear of a residence on Knox Avenue. The motorcycle is worth \$350.

A husband and wife were involved in a domestic dispute Sunday afternoon when about \$10 damage was caused to the bedroom door of a home on Highway 25.

Friday evening, police responded to a domestic complaint on Mill Street East, but no charges were laid and no damage was reported.

A 21-year-old Acton female and a 22-year-old Acton male were charged with liquor offenses early Sunday morning on Mill St. East.
