## ONTARIO'S YOUTH IS READY TO WORK

This summer to get extra work done in your business, hire a young person. Ontario's youth is ready to work, and Ontario will help you pay their wages.

If you can create new work for people aged 15 to 24 this summer Ontario will pay you \$1.25 an hour, to a maximum of \$50 a week, towards each salary. The maximum grant allows for 4,000 hours of help at each location where you would like to hire.

### It's The Ontario Youth Employment Program - OYEP

#### You are eligible for OYEP if:

- You have actively operated a business or farm in Ontario for at least one year prior to April 11, 1983.
- You can provide 25 to 40 hours of supervised work a week for between 8 and 26 consecutive weeks.
- You can create new work, in addition to what they would normally provide between April 11 and October 16.

#### Employees are eligible under OYEP if:

- They are between the ages of 15 and 24.
- They reside and are eligible to work in Ontario.
- They are not related to the employer.

Last year OYEP helped Ontario farmers and businesses hire more than 50,000 young people.
