A \$10,000 deposit was made in November on the Stevens' property. The deposit can be retained by the vendor if the Town decides not to buy the land or it can be applied to the \$650,000 purchase price indicated in the offer to purchase.

Councillor Phil Carney asked what had happened to the two additional appraisals he had requested in January.

Mayor Pete Pomeroy explained the appraisals would be done after the space needs report has been completed and reviewed.

Presumably additional appraisals would be done then only if council decides it is still interested in the Stevens' property.

**Another remand for Pries**

An Eden Mills man charged with cultivating and possession of marijuana has again requested a remand of his case, in Guelph Provincial Court.

Eric Pries was arrested last July after Guelph OPP discovered a large amount of growing and drying marijuana on his parents' property. Pries and his agent Walter Tucker contend the use of marijuana is a ritual in the Church of the Universe, of which Pries is a member.

Tucker turned down a May 2 date for trial explaining that his key witness, Brother Michael Baldasaro is testifying in a similar case in Hamilton May 9 and they want to see the results of that testimony before proceeding with Pries' case. It is a constitutional matter, he said.

May 16 was set for a trial date, by the Crown Attorney, but Tucker argued he only wished to set a date for trial that day rather than proceed. He explained that the May 9 testimony would play a key factor in the Pries case.

The court decided to remand the case to May to set a date for trial.
