

(Continued from Page 1) council at its last meeting in November was to expire January 20, but was extended 60 days.

With the space needs study not coming to council until April another extension was needed, and council went for 90 days this time.

A \$10,000 deposit was made in November on the Stevens' property. The deposit can be retained by the vendor if the Town decides not to buy the land or it can be applied to the \$650,000 purchase price indicated in the offer to purchase.

Councillor Phil Carney asked what had happened to the two additional appraisals he had requested in January.

Mayor Pete Pomeroy explained the appraisals would be done after the space needs report has been completed and reviewed. Presumably additional appraisals would be done then only if council decides it is still interested in the Stevens' property.
