The Vials are similar to the plastic containers prescription pills come in. Inside these vials goes a sheet of paper with the medical and emergency information of all members of the family, such as doctors' names, age, medical problems, special allergies, medication, hospital preferred, etc. The vial is then attached to the rack inside the refrigerator and a sticker put on the outside of the door alerting any emergency team to the existence of the vial.

However, everyone is encouraged to purchase one for the mere price of 50 cents. Only one per family is needed as there is room on the information sheet for all members of the family.

The local police, fire department and ambulance are all aware of the Vial of Life.
