

His suspicions prompted an investigation which eventually lead to the arrest of three people and charges of theft for more than \$100,000 worth of electronic equipment. The matter of the roads came up during a discussion of a boundary change of a property on Lot 6, Concession 6. of lands owned by James Carney. It was later approved.


