Policeman of Month
Sharp eyes stop crime

Amorous couples at dead end roads are not an uncommon find for police, but when Halton Regional Police Constable John Haller arrived at the end of 10th Line near Highway 401 on the night of Feb. 20, he wasn't sure if what he found was love and nothing else.

His suspicions prompted an investigation which eventually led to the arrest of three people and charges of theft for more than \$100,000 worth of electronic equipment.

The investigation handled jointly by Const. Haller of 12 Division (Milton) and Const. Doug Ford of 11 Division, (Georgetown) has earned them the award of police officers of the month.

It was off-duty officer Tom Roduck (Halton Regional Police) who first detected the suspicious vehicle on the dead end road outside of the MacLean-Hunter satellite receiving station, while returning home with his family, and called police.

Const. Haller was immediately dispatched to the scene and arrived to find a couple parked outside the fenced perimeter of the station.

The 11 year police veteran said he became suspicious when he noticed a shadow moving across a building doorway as he approached the car.

Seconds later the door was thrown open as a male person bent a hasty exit out of the building and over a nine-foot wire mesh fence into nearby fields.

Few details

As the case is still before the courts, police are unable to reveal all details of the incident.

As a result of questioning, Const. Haller charged the two occupants in the car with break, enter and theft.

Const. Ford, who arrived within minutes of the original call, began a pursuit of the first suspect, but returned to the scene after losing the suspect.

By then, the officers knew the identity of the youth and later arrested him at his Brampton home, charging him with break, enter and theft.

As a result of the investigation, the two officers were also able to recover a quantity of the stolen equipment.

Const. Doug Ford has worked as a police officer for the past 13 years, the first nine with the Township of Chinguacousy.

In the past four years, he has served as a patrol officer in Oakville, Georgetown and Milton.

He is now completing a study on the new Young Offender's Act which is due to take effect in 1985. He also has an extensive background in criminal investigation and worked in the fraud section while employed with



Constables Haller and Ford.

Peel Regional Police. Married and the father of four children, his interests include photography, fishing and the study of vintage bottles dating back to the late 1800's.

Married and the father of two sons, Const. Haller takes pride in having an extensive coin and gun collection.

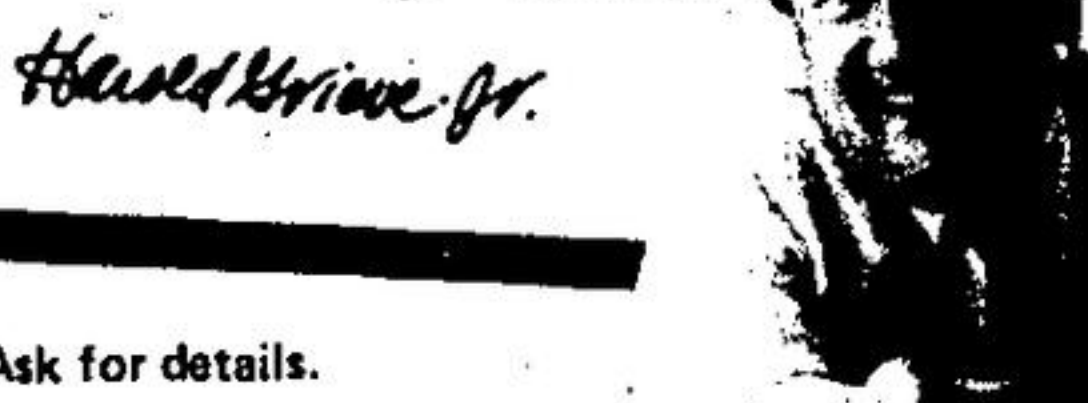
The matter of the roads came up during a discussion of a boundary change of a property on Lot 6, Concession 6, of lands owned by James Carney. It was later approved.
