Job bait

A carrot is being dangled in front of the noses of Ontario's business and farm operators, to stimulate the creation of jobs for the youth of this province.

The bait is being provided by the Ontario Youth Employment Program under the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, in the form of wage subsidies. Eligible employers will receive a grant of \$1.25 per hour to help cover wages for up to 20 weeks.

The program is designed to assist youth hetween the ages of 15 and 25 through the creation of new full-time job opportunities. Grants will be available to employers, in business for at least one year, from April 11 to Oct. 16.

Funds for youth employment will only be supplied if the position is a newly created one, if the job would not have existed without the grant and if the job created is in addition to normal seasonal work.

Existing employees cannot be affected by the creation of a new job. Those hired under the program must be employed for at least 25 hours a week and no more than 40 up to a maximum 4,000 hours.






