## Many improvements in aggregate policy...

Pope noted the government is still looking for public input, he would be taking what he heard that night into consideration.

Foodland Guidelines which will apply to aggregate policies will impact on class one, two and three agricultural lands and Pope felt this was one of the many "improvements" in the new policy and bill.

Before any extraction will be allowed there will have to be proof of rehabilitation to old standards, Pope said.

Freezing of land has been linked to aggregate designation maps in Official Plans

which the province doesn't require now. Pope said there is much more "flexibility" for municipalities to make negative decisions affecting the aggregate industry. Other land uses such as agriculture "may" in some cases take priority over aggregate, evidence of the new flexibility.

Any interference in water courses by the aggregate industry can bring action by both the province as well as civil action in the courts, Pope said.


He rejected suggestions the new policy would still lead to a land freeze or even a "chill." Pope stated the new policy was less

likely than the old one to result in a land freeze for aggregate.

Pope rejected many comments from the Foundation for Aggregate Studies, noting he has met with them more than representatives of the aggregate industry. The new policy reflects the importance of other land uses and makes other improvements as well.

Rehabilitation of pits is taking place and new controls will be even tougher. The new Act will be very clear about financial contributions from the industry too.

The province doesn't want all potential aggregate land mined out, Pope said.
