Only in Canada. In what other country would a political party turf out a leader who had a clear mandate from two-thirds of his party to carry on?


An in what benighted country anywhere would a dozen or so idiots leap to fill tha discarded leader's shoes, knowing full well they could expect the same treatment just down the road?


