

### Juvenile charged

A juvenile has been arrested and charged with five break-ins in Acton between January 26 and March 21.

The 14-year-old broke into the rink and four homes the police report.

The burglar stole property from the homes and arena worth \$10,000 and broke windows to get in causing \$500 damage.

The only stolen item recovered so far is a watch valued at \$150.

### Town settles with workers

Halton Hills has settled on a new contract with Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 73 (the works department outside workers) which will see anyone making over \$20,000 a year receive a five per cent raise.

The five per cent pay boost settlement is in accordance with Ontario public sector employees' wage guidelines.

Anyone making \$15,000 to \$20,000 a year will receive a \$1,000 a year pay hike.

The new pact covers 34 workers and will cost Halton Hills \$34,500 this year.

## Thieves hit arena again this time for wieners

A five kilogram box of wieners was stolen from the Acton Community Centre (arena) sometime between 3 and 10 p.m. Saturday after someone pried off a wire mesh covering a vent. Also taken was an unknown amount of coins from gum ball machines which were damaged. Total damage in the spree was \$90.

A 17-year-old Acton teenager was charged with creating a disturbance by being drunk Saturday about 10:30 p.m. Police had been dispatched to a fight in progress when the accused started shouting obscenities and was abusive. Police asked him to leave the area, but he refused. He was then arrested, police say.

Police laid three liquor charges early Saturday morning as a result of a vehicle check. A 33-year-old male was charged with having care and control of a motor vehicle while with an open bottle of liquor. Two passengers, age 28 and 22, were both charged with consuming liquor in a place other than a licensed premise.

An Acton teenager has been charged with break, enter and theft in connection with the entry of a shed at the rear of Jug City, Main St. N.

Police say entry was gained between midnight and 8 a.m. Thursday, and \$300 worth of bottles in plastic cases were taken.

A 19-year-old male has been charged with driving a car with liquor readily available, after he was stopped on Highway 7 at the Sixth Line of Nassagaweya.

A \$600 barbecue was taken from behind a R.R. 1, Limehouse home sometime last Thursday.

There were no injuries, damages or charges laid when police broke up a struggle between a father and son at an R.R. 1, Acton home about 10:50 p.m. last Tuesday evening.

About \$200 in damages resulted to a vehicle parked on Brock St. last week after someone took a nail or key and deeply scratched the driver's door sometime overnight April 26-27.

A 58-year-old male has been charged with consuming liquor in a place other than a licensed premise after police stopped him Thursday evening at 7:40 on the corner of Bower and Willow.

Police investigated theft of a wallet containing identification but no money from the locker room at the Acton arena during ball hockey last Tuesday night. The wallet was recovered two days later. It was found elsewhere in the rink and nothing was missing. A thief took \$115 from a ladies' purse sometime between 8 and 10 a.m. Sunday, April 24, while the Acton Citizens' Band was rehearsing for its spring concert that night. The victim was a 22-year-old member of the Band.
