# Magical Mystery Tour gets \$4,480 federal grant

Fourteen Summer Canada Porjects have been approved for the Brampton-Georgetown federal riding, MP John McDermid announced this week. The projects will provide jobs to 48 students in the area for

approximately 11 weeks. The Georgetown-Acton Magical Mystery Tour will receive \$4,480. This program will have four major components- all are designed to encourage children and young adults to adopt a lifelong love of reading. Another \$4,900 goes to the Summer Recreation for the Blind program to demonstrate and provide an integrated recreation program for blind and visually impaired children in Halton and Peel.

"All the projects submitted for consideration were worthwhile and it is unfortunate that the existing funding could not be stretched further to create more jobs. said McDermid. An economic upswing is sorely needed to alleviate the unemployment problem." McDermid commented.

The unit is looking for a patient coordinator, who should have some medical background.






