Halton Escarpment Heritage group vows to continue aggregate fight

Dissatisfied with what they heard from Minister of Natural Resources Alan Pope at the recent public meeting in Acton, the Halton Escarpment (H.E.H.) ratepayers' group has vowed to continue fighting the province's aggregate policies.
Chairman Cy Jenkins said in an interview this week about 200 members of the HEH were in attendance at the meeting with Pope and other provincial officials at Acton High School on April 21. HEH claims to speak for over 500 Halton Hills and Milton citizens who signed a petition sent to Pope last fall protesting aggregate policies.
Members of HEH didn't have much to say that night, but guests they brought to the meeting gave Pope a rough ride. Jenkins revealed the H.E.H. had invited Clark Muirhead and Eric Salmond of the Foundation for Aggregate Studies to the meeting and Cambridge Mayor Claudette Miller was also an HEH guest.
He said HEH is "standing shoulder to shoulder" with the Foundation for Aggregate Studies and that group is lobbying Queen's Park for policy changes continually. They have to play things "by ear" to see what their next move in the battle with the province will be. Jenkins said they will continue the fight, but wouldn't tip his hand to the opposition (province) by going into specifics.
The meeting with Pope didn't solve anything, he said. Pope didn't adequately satisfy the audience with his answers. Much of what the cabinet minister said was what has been said for years on this issue. The new aggregate policy raises as many new questions as it answered.
Jenkins said HEH has to take a tough stand on the rehabilitation of pits and quarries apart from any other aspect of the aggregate concern.
Pope discussed rehabilitation, the HEH chairman recalled, but it doesn't appear the cabinet minister has grasped the immensity of the rehabilitation job. Jenkins said Pope doesn't seem to realize how vast the tracts of land are which have already been disturbed for aggregate mining and then left. It will take millions upon millions of dollars to rehabilitate existing pits and quarries.
Many landowners in North Halton are descendants of the pioneers who received land grants in the early 19th century from the British Crown and HEH questions "by what right" does the province "hold a sword over their (the landowners) heads."
The province is threatening to deprive people of the right to use, as they wish, lands which have been in their families for generations, he said.
Considering the actions of the provincial government on the aggregate issue it is little wonder people have "lost faith in the prevailing government of this province."
No designation of aggregate lands in the legal portion of municipal Official Plans is an important "step in the right direction" HEH members feel, but the province needs to make many more changes before people will be satisfied.
The new policy says "aggregates should be available to the consumers of Ontario at a reasonable cost" but HEH asks "a reasonable cost to whom?"
"All parts of Ontario possessing mineral aggregates resources share a responsibility for meeting future provincial demand" but North Halton citizens ask "what about the rights of individuals." HEH complains that
