Police beat

Crowd gathers for fight

About 25 spectators gathered outside the Sit 'N Bull Tavern on Mill Street East early Saturday morning to watch a fight between three people, Halton Regional Police say.

The fight broke out at about 1.40 a.m. and people gathered to watch outside the bar. Another person got involved in the fight at that time, police say.

All three sustained injuries to their faces and hands.

A 25-year-old Holmesway Pl. man has been arrested and charged with causing a disturbance by fighting.

At least one other person will be charged, according to police.

Police also laid a liquor charge against a 37-year-old Acton man who was later taken to Georgetown Hospital and treated for minor injuries.

A set of tools valued at \$500 was taken from a car parked in a driveway of an RR 2 Acton home last week.

A flag with a Led Zeppelin logo on it was stolen from the Acton Arcade at about 9 p.m. Thursday, police report.

The flag, worth about \$10, was later returned. It had been taken as a prank. There were no charges.

Four spoked hubcaps worth \$700 were stolen from a vehicle parked in the area of Prospect Park between 10.20 and 10.50 p.m. Thursday.

Police responded to three domestics in Acton over the weekend on the Fifth Line, Poplar Ave. and Berry St. In all the disputes, no charges were laid and no in-

juries were reported.

An 18-year-old Acton female had her licence suspended for 12 hours Saturday at 3 a.m. on Highway 7. Police say she was also charged with drinking under age.

Police say there were seven liquor charges laid over the weekend. All charged were Acton residents.

Two male juveniles, aged 12 and 14, were apprehended for shoplifting in Zeller's in Georgetown Friday evening. Police say the two Acton boys tried to take about \$10 worth of cars, stickers and gum from the store.

About \$500 in stereo equipment and \$20 cash was stolen from a residence on the Fourth Line during the day on Friday, police report.

Thieves entered through an insecure basement door before taking the stereo equipment and the cash from a bedroom.

Police say the break-in occurred between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m.

A residence on Highway 25 south of Acton was broken into between 10 a.m. and 9.30 p.m. Sunday, police say.

About \$60 in liquor was stolen and there was about \$50 damage caused after thieves broke the glass in a rear door, enabling them to get inside.

Gates outside Indusmin Quarries were damaged by an unknown motor vehicle sometime overnight Thursday, police say. Damage is estimated at about \$300 after culprits unsuccessfully attempted to break through the gates.

Singer coming to AHS

Well known singer and song writer Kevin Denbok, who happens to also be a victim of cystic fibrosis, will be appearing at Acton High School on May 12.

The recording star, his first album is called People Like You and he has also cut a single, will be speaking to an AHS class about Cystic Fibrosis, singing at an assembly and his album will be for sale with proceeds going to Cystic Fibrosis research.

Born and raised in Collingwood, at age 7 Kevin won a gold medal in a school singing contest. He took three years of singing lessons and spent a lot of time performing in operettas and other school musical events. At age 13 he received his first guitar and wrote his first song six months later.

He's appeared on Kids' World, Super Lotto and other television programs and with help of Kinsmen Clubs has been performing at dinners, dances etc.

He has been touring the country appearing at high schools and sales of his album have raised over \$200,000 for Cystic Fibrosis research.

Cystic Fibrosis is a condition that affects

the exocrine system of the body, causing abnormal mucous secretion in the chest and pancreatic areas. This results in clogging of the chest and an inability to digest food properly. Kevin, like others with C.F. (Cystic Fibrosis) is also highly susceptible to bacterial infection. There are rigorous demands placed on time and medical resources for the afflicted individual and his family. Many pills have to be taken to aid in digestion and care must be taken because even the common cold can become a serious complication.

The story behind Kevin's album is interesting. Kevin is aware of his condition and aware that he is not likely to live as long as others who do not have C.F. He is also aware that he has a talent, a talent he is not supposed to have, since C.F. is essentially a condition that affects the lungs. But Kevin also has courage and determination. One day, Kevin expressed his goals to a Kinsman, Art Frewin. His goal was simple, to produce a record album that could properly represent his talent and also sensitize people to the needs of those with C.F.
