Eramosa taxes up

The average tax bill in Eramosa township will be going up about \$66.50. This is a seven per cent increase over last year.

Township council Monday struck their 1983 budget which saw a \$19 per \$1,000 assessment hike. The average assessment in the township is \$3,000 to \$3,500.

Eden Mills and Rockwood police villages will see a slightly larger increase, explains township clerk Lloyd Hindley, as there has been a change in the apportionment to the township, on the advice of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs.

According to the Ministry the villages have not been paying enough of the municipal share, for the services they have that rural homes do not (such as garbage pick-up, street lights, etc.). This increase is being spread out over two years so as not to hit the taxpayer too hard all at once, councillors decided.

Property assessed at \$4,000 would see a \$78 increase, and a \$5,000 assessment will have a \$95 hike.

This includes Township. education and county taxes, which must all be collected by the Township.
