

More secretaries may soon be school reality

A proposal by administrative staff of the Halton Board of Education could see secretarial bours increased substantially in

Halton schools. Rae Stoness, superintendent of Employee Services told the board Thursday evening that the present policy of staffing for elerical workers has not been changed since 1969, even though the workload has changed "dramatically".

In a report to trustees, Stoness noted that of 72 elementary schools, 43 do not have full time secretaries. Offices are staffed anywhere from two and a half days a week to four and a half days.

Under the Stoness proposal, 30 hours of secretarial / clerical help would be allocated to those schools which at the present time do not qualify for full-time office staff. Instead of working seven hours a day, however, he noted, staff would work six hours, making sure the office was covered while the children were in school.

Besides the concern of increased workload, the report stated, there was also concern for student care and safety, office security, communication and public relations. reception and ineffective use of principal

time, in cases where the principal has to answer telephones or work in reception.

The present formula for staffing of offices is two and a half cierical days for schools from 51 to 150 students, three days for 151 to 250 students, four days with schools 351 to 450 students, etc., up to 11 days per week with 1051 to 1150 enrolment.

The Stoness proposal would change this to 25 clerical hours a week for 51 to 150 enrolment, (30 if twinned), 30 hours for 151 to 250 students and 251 to 375 students, up to 65 hours for schools with 851 to 950 students.

A pool of casual assistance (900 days) will be administered by the Superintendent of Employee Services to meet emergency needs, including the development of the "Emergency Telephone Network." and clerical assistance will be provided in August to all schools commensurate with enrolment, program and organization, the report noted.

Trustees will discuss the report and the proposal further at another meeting:


