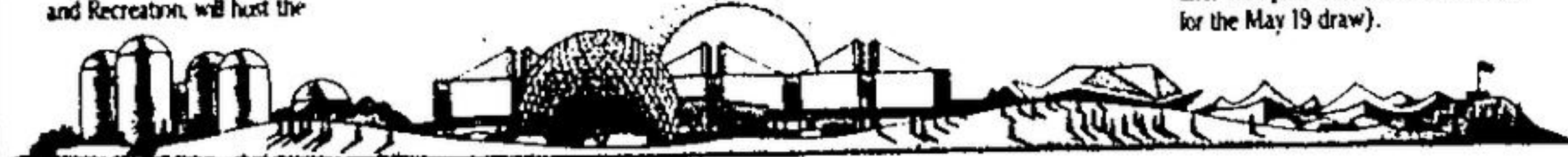

Extensive renovations for Sit 'N' Bull restaurant

Opening a dining lounge is a new experience for the four partners involved in the Sit 'N' Bull restaurant on Mill St. "It's the first time any of us has been in a venture of this kind," Jack Meinen, one of the principals, explained last week. "It's been quite a learning experience—and so far, so good."

The Sit 'N' Bull has been open for a month. Meinen and his partners, Des Noblett, Ron Noblett, and Lene Fisker, took over the 747 Restaurant premises in February and did extensive renovations, some still ongoing before opening the lounge. At the moment, you can get drinks, breakfast, and a buffet lunch there. Eventually, Meinen says, the restaurant will serve a complete dinner menu.

The location, on Mill St. just west of Main, has run the gauntlet of former pool hall, theatre, and roller rink before becoming the comfortable dining-dancing spot Meinen and his partners hope to make it.

Although the opening has been gradual—for awhile it operated as a small dining room in the back—The Sit 'N' Bull is already offering live entertainment on weekends, and even some entertainers early in the week in the lounge.

The music is of the popular, middle-of-the-road variety. "We're staying away from loud bands, pop or punk rock," Meinen promises.

The restaurant employs 18 people, all from the Acton area.

They hope the entertainment and the upcoming full-course dinner menu (including buffet) will draw crowds from Milton, Georgetown and even Guelph. Already the place enjoys a brisk weekend business.

Decoration Day plans in jeopardy

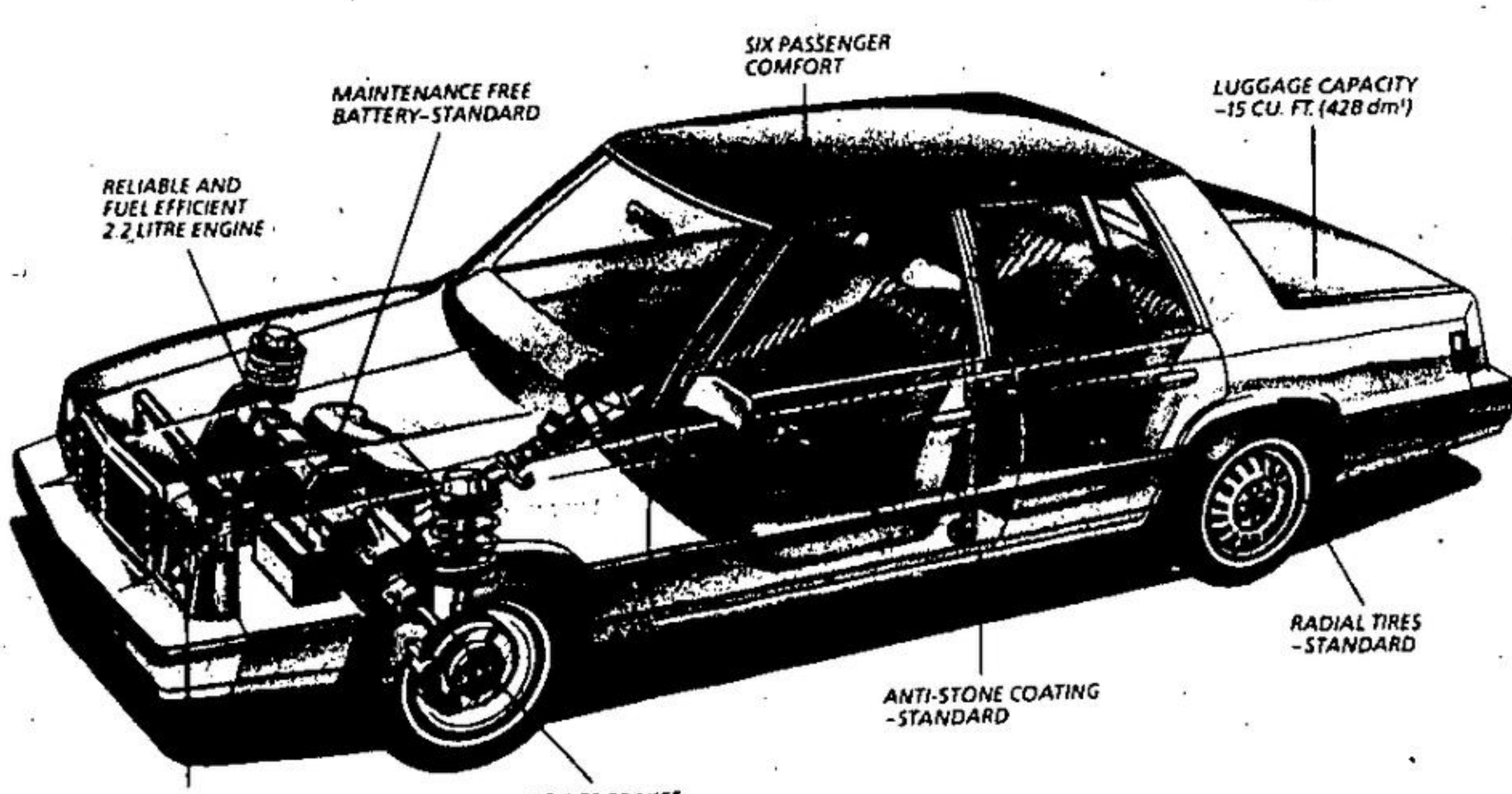
Decoration Day may not be observed in Acton this year.
