**Council to review fund**

Halton Hills council is going to review its bylaw which places all lot levies in a reserve fund to finance a new administration building.

Budget committee called for the review in presenting its final capital budget and four year capital spending forecast, 1984-87, to general committee Monday night.

Chairman Ross Knechtel pointed out the committee's report said "At present we have a bylaw which allocates all lot levies to a fund for a new administrative centre. The budget committee suggests that this should be reviewed by council. There are some dangers inherent in our present practice and we suggest that staff prepare a report for council's early consideration." He added a new bylaw may be needed and called the matter a "bookkeeping" measure.

There have been some questions in the past if it is proper for council to funnel all lot levies into a fund for a single project.

The budget committee also included a \$1 million debenture for a new administration building or municipal complex in its spending forecast for 1984. Knechtel said this wasn't an indication of the committee members' views on if the building should be constructed or not, but simply a case of the \$1 million debenture being in last year's forecast and until a final decision was made on the issue it shouldn't be removed.

The 1983 capital budget was approved back with the rest of the 1983 Town budget. However budget committee was now adding \$300,000 for a possible debenture for Halton Hills Hydro Commission for a new administration building.

Council and Hydro Commission has been talking about possibly housing both government bodies in a single administration building but no decision has been made yet.

**Inmate escapes work gang**

A 24-year-old male Guelph Correctional Centre inmate left the work gang he was working with on 15 Sideroad, just west of Highway 25 Thursday afternoon, police say.

The inmate is the second one in two weeks to leave the work gang who are chopping wood in the bush. He left the six man gang at about 1.45 p.m.

Police are looking for a man described as being about 5'7", about 160 pounds with hazel eyes and wearing blue clothes.

Halton Regional Police have issued a warrant for his arrest.

The first inmate to leave the work gang on May 11 surrendered to Sudbury police Thursday, according to Halton Regional Police.

A 23-year-old female from Acton was charged with driving with an open bottle of liquor on Highway 7 west of Highway 25 Saturday evening.

A 17-year-old Acton youth has been charged with theft over \$200 and taking an automobile without consent in connection with the theft of a car from a parking lot on Kingham Rd. Saturday night.

A 16-year-old Milton resident was charged with possession of a narcotic when he was found to have a small quantity of hashish outside the Acton Arcade Sunday afternoon, police say.

Police laid two liquor charges last Thursday morning on Mill St. West. A 23-year-old Acton resident was charged with impaired driving at about 1.40 a.m. At the same time and place, a 43-year-old male was charged with being intoxicated in a public place.
