### Watch for children signs are rejected by council

Watch for Children signs have finally been rejected for two rural roads, the Sixth Line and 22 Sideroad.  
Councillor Pam Sheldon had brought the request for the signs to council. On the first vote last month the staff recommendation that the signs not be put up—council narrowly defeated the motion. However a motion stating the signs should be put up wasn't proposed.  
When the matter came up for review because of the confusion over what should be done it was deferred until Councillor Russ Miller, who had broken the tie on the previous motion, was in attendance.  
Last Tuesday the matter was raised at Halton Hills council again. Miller said the signs would be up on 22 Sideroad for only a short time before there is reconstruction while they would be up for some time on the Sixth Line.  
Sheldon said it was a waste of time and money spending so much time on such a simple little matter. People in the rural area wanted and believed in these signs and they had made a valid request. She thought if a sign went up on the Sixth Line it should also be erected on 22 Sideroad.  
Engineer Robert Austin pointed out there weren't any Watch for Children signs in stock, they would have to be ordered specially.  
The motion to put up the signs on the two roads was lost.
