In the ten kilometre race Rod Schuller led for most of the way but it was Robert Morrison crossing the finish line first in a time of 36 minutes and 49 seconds. Irma Smith claimed the female title in 43 minutes 42 seconds.

In the M and M Pro Sport Junior category it was Glenn Mulder claiming the boys title ahead of Eddie Power and Stephen Eastwood while Sheila Huffman ran first for the girls with Melissa Morey and Tara Bouskill second and third respectively.
