## Limits on councillor benefits

There are a lot of medical and other fringe benefits available to members of Halton Hills council, but there are limits on how much they could vote themselves this year. A report from staff detailed various benefits councillors could give themselves, including OHIP; a dental plan; major medical coverage including a dental plan; life insurance; long term disability; accidental death and dismemberment insurance; and a pension plan. If councillors were to opt to take all the benefits, the cost would range from \$877.08 for a councillor with no dependents to \$2,057.40 for a mayor with dependents. There have been no indications if councillors would pay benefits themselves or if benefits would be part of their wages. Earlier this year councillors voted not to give themselves a raise, though under provincial public sector wage guidelines

they were entitled to a five per cent hike. The five per cent ceiling doesn't apply just to wages but also benefits if taxpayers foot the bill, so if councillors decide to give themselves some benefits the maximum they are allowed this year is \$874.50 worth of benefits for the mayor and \$346.10 for each councillor.

A staff survey of Milton, Oakville, Burlington, Caledon and Halton region showed few are offering any fringe benefits, and in most cases for those councils which do have benefits the councillors pay for the benefits themselves.

The whole matter was deferred at general committee last week so it can be discussed when the mayor is in attendance. Councillor Mike Armstrong noted it was Mayor Peter Pomeroy who had expressed an interest in benefits for councillors.

## Students raise more than \$6,000 for Indian village

The heavy rains also cut short an appearance at the Festival by the Spoons—the internationally known rock band from Burlington. The Spoons, including Gord Deppe, Sandy Horn, Derrick Ross and Rob Preuss, will be performing a Crawford Lake benefit concert at Hamilton Place on Thursday, September 29.

The admission ticket to the Festival also served as a draw ticket for seven prizes. The winner of Leigh Cockburn's original acrylic painting of Crawford Lake was Mr. Harry Godeau of Burlington.

The winner of a framed original print of Robert Bateman's "Kingfisher in Winter" was young Kristina Ingleson of Rockwood, who was standing right beside Bateman when he drew the winning ticket.

The five ticket holders who will be taking their families on a nature hike guided by Bob and Birgit Bateman later this year are Jeff Wilson of Burlington, Donna Goldthorp of Toronto, Mrs. V. Maruca of Burlington, Barbara Gaasenbeek of Burlington and William Overall of Burlington.

The Batemans are co-chairmen of the Crawford Lake education committee. The nature hike will include a visit to the Bateman studio and home on the Niagara Escarpment in north Burlington.
