

# Juniors back on track with 9-7 and 7-1 wins

After a couple of back to back Ontario Junior Football League losses, it seems that the Acton Junior A's are back on track. In action this past week the A's picked up a pair of victories, edging Kitchener 9-7 last Tuesday evening and then coming up with a solid effort and a 7-1 win over Linwood.

In Kitchener the A's trailed 5-2 after five innings, but a six run outburst in the sixth lifted Acton to victory.

The hosts came back with two count of their own in the seventh, but it was not enough.

Acton claimed a 2-0 lead in the second inning as a walk to Gord McArthur and then base hits by Tim Baker, Dick Spear, and Kelly McArthur brought the runs home.

Kitchener got one back off Acton pitcher Roy Spear in the fourth and a walk and three straight base hits in the fourth brought home four more, sending Dick Spear to the mound to get the final out of the inning.

Roy Spear started off the sixth inning uprising and followed by a double to Glen Scott, walks to Gord McArthur and Baker, a single by Dick Spear and a three run triple

by Kelly McArthur. Kitchener picked up two runs on three hits in the seventh, but Dick Spear retired the side in order through the final two innings for the win, while the A's added one more in the eighth as Baker crossed the plate.

Dick Spear carried the big stick, belting out three singles in five trips, but it was Kelly McArthur's four RBIs that did the most damage.

The A's wasted little time getting on the Linwood pitching Monday night, scoring once in the first and four more times in the third to take control. Singles in the fourth and sixth rounded out the Acton scoring while Linwood managed their lone run off Dick Spear in the eighth inning.

Baker claimed the first Acton tally with a double. Baker scored on a Roy Spear single. In the third, the first Four A's to the plate crossed home as Gord McArthur, Baker, Dick Spear and Dave Wilson came in.

Baker scored a third straight time in the fourth building the Acton lead further and then Roy Spear's triple brought brother Dick around to score. Dick Spear struck out 14 and allowed just four Linwood hits to claim the win. Dave Wilson was the big batter belting out three base hits while Gord McArthur, Dick Spear and Roy Spear belted two each.

North-Halton Road Hugger George Gidman placed fourth over-all in the Open 800 metre event at the York University All-Comers Meet last Tuesday.

George ran a personal-best time of 1:54.55 in the final.

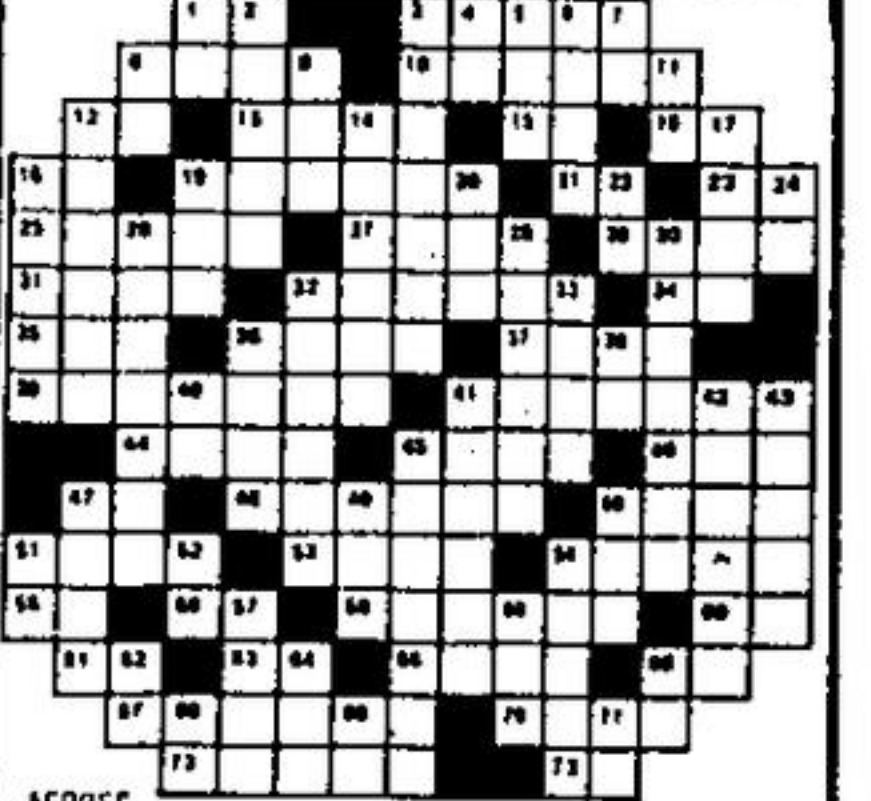
The playoff champions were Dave Beerman, Peg Mitchell, Heather Stuckless, Fred Blain, Jill Gray, and Cheryl Phillips.
