**Staff wants station**

Halton Hills is going to spend \$3,639 for a repeater station at the central works yard on Trafalgar Rd.  
Last week Halton Hills general committee approved purchase and installation of the communications equipment by Two Way Communications Ltd.  
A staff report indicated mobile to mobile communications by supervisors and workers out in the field is becoming more important. Mobile to mobile communications have deteriorated in recent months engineer Robert Austin noted.  
While this purchase wasn't included in the 1983 budget, other purchases have been below budget leaving a surplus of funds which can be spent on the repeater station.

**Board briefs**

**Teachers get raise**  
Continuing Education teachers in Halton were granted a pay raise Thursday evening which would see them being paid from \$15.82 an hour to \$19.66, depending on their experience and education.  
In a report to the board, trustee Elaine Riehm, chairperson for the salary policy committee recommended that effective July 1, Halton and Non-Halton Teachers with Ontario Teacher's Certificate (OTC) will be paid \$19.66 per hour, an increase from \$18.75.  
Teachers without OTC, with experience as per 1981-82 rates would receive an 80 cent hike to \$16.92 an hour, and those with no experience will receive \$15.82, up from \$15.08.  
**Program is expanded**  
With a warning from Esqueping trustee Dick Howitt, Halton Board of Education Thursday voted to expand the Family Studies/Industrial Arts program to include all grades 7 and 8 and abolish it in grade 6.  
George Heaver, of Special Services, pointed out students would be receiving 64 hours of the subject on a six day cycle, and 74 hours on a five day.  
Howitt warned the board to look at the entire timetable, and not isolate this one area.  
"The cause of my concern is the erosion of time that's taking place on English Language Arts, and other subjects," he said. "The board should not deal with it in isolation."
