Police Fraud

Conference helps nabbing of crooks

Forty police officers and other investigators from all over Southern Ontario attended a Fraud Conference Thursday at the Acton Legion, sponsored by the Halton Regional Police.

The conferences, held about three times a year, are conducted to assist in the investigation of outstanding crimes by various departments, according to one of this conference's organizers, Halton Constable Doug Ford.

"We pick each other's brains," Ford said, "to help each other. It's a meeting of the minds," he said in an interview with this newspaper. Officers let the others know who they are looking for, various crimes committed, and issue warnings to watch for certain modis operandi.

Halton Inspector James Currie revealed Halton will someday have a fraud squad of its own, but it is a question of prior-

ities. Right now, various detectives and officers investigate the fraud cases.

Representatives were from Niagara, Durham, Waterloo, Peel, London, Metro Toronto, Hamilton / Wentworth, OPP anti-racket squad, Ontario Fire Marshal's Office, Ontario Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations, RCMP Hamilton, Guelph City Police, CIBC, Scotia-Bank, Toronto Dominion Bank, Mastercard, Centre of Forensic Sciences, and Royal Bank.

Constable Ford cited one case where a cheque writer had been stolen and fraudulent cheques were written all over Canada. As far as Halton knew, the suspect was still at large. However, at one of the fraud conferences, it was discovered the suspect was in jail in Toronto on other charges. It is a good example of how the conferences are beneficial to all involved.
