calibre riders here in Ontario to do it, but we just can't get a track," he said.

It angers Joe Gardin that even professional riding doesn't scare up any support in Ontario, let alone Canada.

He notes Canadian riders will be going to a race in the United States where the top prize for two-hours racing will be \$25,000. The only thing that comes close is the CHIN International Picnic where the Italian Canadian Cycling Club has a \$15,000 race, but you have to travel 100 kilometres to win it.

In addition to believing the riders of the 20s and 30s were stronger, Mr. Benotto feels that the ultimate perimeters of racing bicycle design have been reached.

"Aerodynamic bicycles have not worked, although much was hoped for them. There are still some little things we can do, but they are fine tuning. It is to the riders that we will look for the increases," he said.

With that, Joe Gardin announces that he

has had enough with trying to encourage Ontario to set up "a proper training facility."

Looking out the window of his home, he says, "I have 100 acres here and I am willing to donate the land if it means we can have a good training facility built here for our riders."

Although he says he has not had much to do with governmental funding agencies, he is prepared to start talking with "Sport Canada, the Ontario Government, or anyone who we can convince of the very great need we have in Ontario."

"We have the riders, they have the ability and we just need someone to get us a spot to train, and we can bring an Olympic medal home to Ontario."

"We don't have much time, but we could be ready for the next Olympics, but we better be ready for the games because we can't let this talent go to waste just because they can't train properly," Mr. Gardin said.
