# Provincial proposal could lower taxes

A take from the rich, give to the poor scheme by the Ministry of Education could, in theory, lower taxes in Halton Hills and Milton.

James Martin, director of grants and policies for the Ministry attended a special Halton Board of Education meeting Monday evening to explain a proposal which would redistribute monies across the province in an attempt to equalize the funding of education of all children.

A provincial ceiling (of \$2,171, elementary, and \$2,978 secondary in 1982) per pupil is being closely followed by the poorer boards, while the more affluent areas overspend by as much as \$500 per pupil, Martin pointed out. At \$300 over the ceiling, Halton is not considered one of the rich boards, he said.

Based on equalized assessment, a common mill rate will be charged across Ontario for education taxes, Martin explained. In smaller municipalities in the province, they may raise only 10 per cent of the ceiling, while Metro Toronto or Ottawa may raise 90 per cent. Under the proposal, the per pupil amount would be the same, and anything over that would have to be raised locally, without the help of provincial grants. Right now, the province is footing 50 per cent of the education bill in Ontario giving out \$2.9 billion in grants, of \$5.9 billion spent. It averages out to 50 per cent, but in Halton is actually less.

Martin's plans would equalize the residential tax burden and raise the commercial and industrial assessment, if the board spends over the set ceiling. He noted if the residential mill rate in Burlington is 85, then the commercial would be 100. If 100 is for residential, then the commercial would be 117.6.

"We would like to equalize the assessment for calculation of grants and apportionments purposes," the director said.

Under the present system, Martin said, all assessment is equalized.

Under questioning, Martin admitted he could not just raise the ceiling per pupil. He explained that by doing this, the smaller boards would be penalized because of the big spending boards. Right now, he said, there are 43 boards who spend more than \$300 over the ceiling.

Martin's figures revealed Halton Hills, Milton and Burlington are paying more than their share of education taxes, and implementation of Martin's plan would see local taxes going down.

Trustee Elaine Riehm pointed out that the tax roles in currently wealthy boards would go up, Martin agreed.

Martin assured the trustees and staff that the level of expenditure would not change, but there could be a little extra raised on taxation that is being redistributed over the phasing in period of two or three years.

"The whole system is confusing now, so why not have it just a little more confusing," Martin stated.

## Town may help time seminar

If the chambers of commerce in Georgetown and Acton help sponsor the event Halton Hills and the Town Libraries will stage a time management seminar later this year at the cultural centre in Georgetown.

Last week Halton Hills general committee agreed to help sponsor the event, but the chambers of commerce must agree to help pay for it.

The seminar is being planned by the library and apparently details of sponsorship haven't been nailed down yet with the chambers of commerce. Councillor Dave Whiting observed there has been poor communications.

Clerk-administrator Ken Richardson reported total cost of the seminar would be \$3,130 or \$31 per person if 200 people attend. He figured the highest cost to the Town would be \$1,000 and added there is \$2,500 in the budget for Town employee education. He said a similar seminar was held elsewhere in Halton and was quite successful and that prompted the library board to try one in Halton Hills. He said it will be an excellent opportunity to promote the cultural centre as a location for such gatherings as conferences and seminars.

Councillor Harry Levy objected to the library board now asking for a subsidy for an event when their budget was cut by council earlier this year. He noted grants have been refused other groups and he felt the Town shouldn't be contributing for this seminar.

Just because Town staff would attend the seminar was no reason for the municipality to help pay to put it on, Councillor Finn Poulstrup observed.

A time management course wouldn't be that much of a benefit to Town workers who are quite productive now, Councillor Pam Sheldon said. She thought a seminar in effective communications between the Town and Library board would be more useful.

Councillor Marilyn Serjeantson thought the town should participate calling the seminar a good investment in staff and potential uses for the cultural centre.

It would be an excellent seminar, Councillor Mike Armstrong said, adding as long as there was a crowd there would be no big cost to the Town.

Richardson said there had been no lack of communication between the Town and library and there had been several attempts to contact the chambers of commerce. He thought the seminar would be good for 30 to 40 town employees and felt there would be no problem attracting a big crowd for the seminar. He added staff education has been underpinned the past two years. The seminar would be helpful to local business as well as government.

Councillor Ross Knechtel thought the seminar was excellent but was reluctant to support it unless costs were all worked out in advance.

Mayor Pete Pomeroy said the debate wasn't necessary since if the chambers don't help sponsor the seminar it won't be held.
