

Five of 24 charges dealt with in court as Copeland pleads

Timothy Glen Copeland, R.R. 3, Milton (Horton Hills) pleaded guilty and was convicted of five charges in Milton Provincial court Thursday, including drug trafficking, fraud and acting under false pretences.

In total Copeland faced a total of 24 charges in court. Some won't be handled until he goes back to court for sentencing on the five counts of which he's already convicted on September 20. Simple cannabis possession charges were dropped Thursday against Copeland.

He pleaded guilty to selling a quarter ounce of "high grade" marijuana to an undercover officer in Milton on February 2. He also pleaded guilty to selling a quarter ounce of black hashish to the same officer on February 18.

Another drug trafficking charge involving cocaine from an incident on March 15 won't be heard until September 20. Federal Prosecutor Murray Haesler said at that time they expect either to set a date for trial on that charge or for Copeland to submit his plea.

The court also learned Thursday that on January 25 a Milton man reported to police his wallet, containing personal papers, identification and credit cards, had been stolen.

On February 10, knowing a Shell oil credit card had been stolen and claiming to authorities later that he was given the card by someone, Copeland

used the credit card to buy \$34 worth of gas at a station in Hornby. He signed the credit card receipt using the name of the man the card was issued to.

On February 17 he and a young woman went to a video rental outlet in Oakville, and using the stolen identification he rented a VCR, case and three tapes. The value of the machine, case and tapes, which haven't been recovered, was \$973. He paid for the rental using a cheque and signed the name of the man who'd had his wallet stolen.

The next day he rented another VCR and two tapes from Video Station in Georgetown, again using the stolen identification. This equipment and tapes, valued at \$777, were never returned either.

Copeland pleaded guilty to the forgery and false pretense charges and was convicted.

Assistant Crown Attorney Brad Calhoun said Copeland is living at home now instead of in Milton and he and his family are involved in counselling.

There will be a pre-sentence report compiled for Copeland before he goes back to court in September.

Calhoun said the Crown will wait and see how Copeland's counselling and living at home affects the accused. This may influence how the other charges are dealt with. Besides the drug trafficking, fraud and false pre-

tense charges. Copeland also faces charges dealing with break and enter, possession of

stolen property worth more than \$200 and less than \$300; theft over and theft under \$200;

forgery; impersonation with intent. A number of charges still to be dealt with are in con-

nection with use of the stolen credit card and stolen identification.

GLAZED STRAWBERRY PIE
1 quart Ontario strawberries
1 baked 11" pie shell
125 mL sugar
45 mL cornstarch
250 mL water
5 mL vanilla
50 mL sliced almonds, toasted
Wash, pat dry and hull strawberries. Reserve 250 mL strawberries and puree. Put whole berries into pie shell, stem and down. Combine sugar, cornstarch, water, vanilla and pureed strawberries in small saucepan. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a boil. Simmer for 5 minutes. Cool slightly. Pour evenly over berries in pie shell. Sprinkle with almonds. Chill 3 hours. Garnish with whipped cream, if desired. Makes 6 to 8 servings.
