

Some residents on Cobblehill Rd. will be allowed to go into Fairview Cemetery and cut down four willow trees.

Colin and Sylvia Ash, 48 Cobblehill Rd., Margaret Smith, 58 Cobblehill Rd., Eileen and Harold Saville, 50 Cobblehill Rd., and Robert Barrow, 54 Cobblehill Rd. sent a letter to the Town asking that something be done about the trees which are just inside the cemetery fence behind their homes.

They said they were concerned about drainage problems, roots of the trees stretching onto their properties and possibly damaging swimming pools, leaves falling all the time, and the willow trees interfering with growth of shrubs on their properties.


