Eric Pries, of Eden Mills, pleaded guilty to posession of a narcotic in Guelph Provincial Court.

Cultivation charges were dropped by Crown Attorney Ron Noble Monday.

Pries was charged last August 22 after Guelph OPP found a green garbage bag containing 59 marijuana plants in a barn on his parents' property in Eden Mills. The contents weighed a total of five pounds. which would be less than one pound of useable material, Noble told Judge J. Howitt.

Also found on the property were garden boxes containing


