

# Liquor permit for Yugoslav picnic

Haltom Hills council has approved a liquor permit for a picnic on August 7 at the Yugoslav Centre on Highway 25.

The Town has been giving out permits one at a time for picnics this summer based on how well the previous event went in terms of keeping noise from disturbing neighbors.

The police received an anonymous complaint about noise during the last picnic at the Yugoslav Centre on July 17. When the police arrived on the scene most people were already leaving because rain had started and he found no noise

problem at that time.

Mike Milicevic of the Canadian Yugoslav Radio Club will be in charge of the picnic on August 7 and told councillors Monday night he expects a crowd of 300 to 500 people. Loud speakers will be used only to amplify music in the area of the bandstand. Off duty police will be hired for the event.

On July 17, Councillor Ross Knechtel said, he drove to three sides of the Yugoslav Centre and you couldn't hear noise late in the afternoon unless you listened "intently." The noise wasn't "objectionable."

# No word yet on cause of fire

Haltom Hills fire chief Bill Cunningham says his department still can't say what caused the big Thomas' Video store and overhead apartments fire on July 3.

A couple of days after the fire Cunningham said it would be about two weeks before his department heard back from the Fire Marshal's office and Centre for Forensic Science. He says the forensic science centre must be pretty busy because they don't expect word back now on their findings for

another week.

Three or four samples of "debris" found at the fire scene were sent to the forensic science centre for examination by a Fire Marshal's office investigator.

Even when they get word back from the forensic science centre, Cunningham says they may not have the fire cause. He said while the forensic analysis won't give the cause it may produce valuable leads.

Then again the cause of the fire may never be determined, he said.
