Another safety feature is that the inside scaffolding has been connected or tled to the exterior scafolding.

"When we're done there's no reason why it won't last another 100 years. It will probably be in better shape than it was when it was built," Tyler sald.

There isn't a lot of evidence of things being accomplished yet "because we've done a lot of tearing down and flxing that people can't see."

Besides the many time consuming jobs which had to be done, Tyler noted there have been delays awaiting drawings and specs as well as various approvals.

good." While the project's two to three weeks behind schedule, Tyler expects everything to be back on track soon. Because the project is under budget, crew sixes will be larger the next little while so a few more people will have a job thanks to this project.

The addition hasn't been dropped either. Tyler feels they are close to an agreement with the fire department about how large an access alley they should have at the side of the building.

The first floor former council chambers will be a meeting room while the old police office will be a rented office. There will be a kitchen and serving area on both the first and second floors. There are plans for a nostalgia corner and an old jail cell will be another Acton history display area. Washrooms on both floors will, have handicapped facilities, there's a semi-circular ramp planned to the first floor from the addition and an elevator to the second. A parkette in front of the addition, with an old fashloned light and park bench, is contemplated. A small community information office is also shown on the revised architect's drawings.

This addition is smaller than the one first proposed by Heritage Acton and Tyler said if the firefighters go along with this plan they feel they can get a make-work grant to help fund it.

But the addition is no pressing matter yet, they want to keep plugging away at the old hall first.

"It's really like building a new building, except doing it the hard way," Tyler said of the restoration project. "It's sort of like when you restore an old car."

Tyler feels they are about half way done the job. "We can start to see what the end result will be like and it's something we can be proud of."
