**Woman is slapped**

Halton Regional police are investigating a physical assault on an Acton woman on Jeffrey Ave. Thursday evening. Police say the 21-year-old female was pinned against the wall and slapped on the face at about 5.45 p.m. Thursday. She reportedly knew her assailant. A 47-year-old Acton man was arrested twice in one day and charged both times with being intoxicated in a public place. Police say the first arrest was made at 12.55 a.m. Saturday in the vicinity of 6 Mill St. Several hours later, at 3 p.m., he was again arrested, also on Mill St. Impaired driving charges were laid Sunday afternoon against a 51-year-old Mississauga man, after he was stopped at the railroad tracks on Main St. He was also charged with having over 80 milligrams of alcohol in his blood. Several liquor charges were laid last Tuesday and Wednesday. A 24-year-old Acton man was stopped on River St. Tuesday at 12.15 a.m. and charged with impaired driving. On Wednesday, two 16-year-old Acton youths were charged with drinking underage and being intoxicated in a public place on Mill St. east at 2.15 a.m. Two liquor charges were laid in separate incidents in Prospect Park last week also.

An 18-year-old male from Acton was charged Tuesday around 4 p.m. for being intoxicated in a public place and another 19-year-old was charged with having liquor displayed in public view at 2 p.m. Wednesday. A 17-year-old R.R. 5 Milton youth has been charged with break, enter and theft in connection with an incident at a Gould Cres. home July 18 during which \$30 worth of liquor was taken. About \$15 damage was sustained by a rear window of a bull-dozer parked on Mill St. around midnight, Tuesday. Two juveniles approximately 12 to 14 years of age were spotted at the scene. A 1976 Honda worth about \$800 was stripped of four wheels, then tipped into a swamp area in Limehouse recently, police say. Vandalism went into the fenced-in vacant lot and destroyed the car, but there is no specific time of the vandalism. A 17-year-old Acton female was charged with drinking underage July 21 and a 19-year-old Acton female was charged with drinking liquor in a public place. Three youths set fire to a garbage can behind Acton High School at 10 p.m. Thursday, police say.

**Glen house used by local firefighters**

Acton firefighters will be joining their Georgetown colleagues in using a house in Glen Williams as a training building until October. The former Davidson house, behind the ball diamond, was going to cost between \$3,400 and \$9,140 to be demolished. Instead it will be put to use one day a week by each of

the departments. The building will be boarded up after each training session, according to fire chief Bill Cunningham and will be burned down under the department's supervision when the training period ends. The basement will be filled in with the remaining debris. The cost to the fire department will be about \$300.
