Provincial police body pats Halton on back

Halton Regional Police Force has come through its 1983 Ontario Police Commission (OPC) Audit or review with flying colors again.

"In submitting his 1983 Audit Report, the OPC inspector stated that he has concluded that the force appears to be providing an excellent level of service to the community. Not only does it provide high quality pollcing, but it does so with a police-topopulation ratio that is comparatively low for police organizations with this degree of sophisticcation," a press release from Chief James Harding stated.

"During the period May 25 to June 9, the Inspections Staff of OPC conducted its Annual Audit of the Halton Regional Police Force.

"The subsequent report confirms that the recommeddations for improvement made in previous years by inspecting OPC staff have been successfully completed.


