Even though we're more than half-way through the summer, (unfortunately), many may find the following information both interesting and useful.

The Hamilton Automobile Association gives advice on "The Easiest Way to obtain a Canadian passport."

Secure the necessary application for a passport. Complete the application, providing; proof of citizenship, such as birth certificate or citizenship certificate; two passport photos, outside dimensions of 2" x 2 1/2", as per directions on the passport application. Photos must be stamped on the back by the person taking the photo and dated, as well as the bottom portion signed by the individual. (NOTE: The Free Press does NOT take passport photos, so please don't ask us to); your present passport if valid must also be included with your application.

Cost per passport is \$21, and it is valid for five years from date of issue.

If you are going overseas and intend to rent and drive a car, your Ontario driver's licence is acceptable in some

countries, but not in others. So an International Driver's Permit is a wise precaution. Entry into some countries requires a visa. Better check this out.
