Secure the necessary application for a passport. Complete the application, providing; proof of citizenship, such as birth certificate or citizenship certificate; two passport photos, outside dimensions of 2" x 214", as per directions on the passport application. Photos must be stamped on the back by the person taking the photo and dated, as well as the bottom portion signed by the individual. (NOTE: The Free Press does NOT take passport photos, so please don't ask us to); your present passport if valid must also be included with your applica-

Cost per passport is \$21, and it is valid for five years from date of issue. If you are going overseas and intend to rent and drive a car, your Ontario driver's licence is acceptable in some


