Clergy Comment

by Rev. Jean Stairs Last week I visited with a retired minister who is both a cheristred friend and a good theologian rolled up into one.

He had recently acquired an old dog which he had taught some new tricks. Of them all, the one that impressed me most required a doggie biscuit or some other tasty morsel. When placed at the dog's foot it was to remain there as long as my friend said the words "on trust". After what seemed like an agonizingly long and tormenting time, the dog was then permitted to devour the tidbit.

My theologian friend, who sometimes can sound a bit absentminded, said in a moment of reflection, "Too bad God didn't create more dogs and canines and less of the twolegged species." I laughed at the time, but now see the depth of his simple comment.

God has given us, the two-legged species, a world "on trust", but we seem hell-bent on its destruction. We pollute its waters, set fire to its habitations, litter and deface its grounds and, as if that is not enough, we even create mechanisms that could terminate the lives of all canine creatures and children that exist upon it.

Surely we ought to hear the message implicit in that phrase "on trust". If anything, for my friend's dog and so too for us, the pay-off ought to be worh it, in the end.

Blue Ribbon for paper

The Acton Free Press was recently awarded a Blue Ribbon for a strong showing in the Canadian Community Newspaper Association's annual Better Newspapers Competition.

The Free Press earned 83 out of a possible 100 marks in the General Excellence Class Three Broadsheet (circulation 3,500 to 4,499) competition. This paper was fifth in a field of 20 entries from Ontario, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Nova Scotia, and Alberta, Judging was based on two mandatory issue submissions from 1982.

Finishing ahead of the Free Press was the Carleton Place Canadian (Ont.); Quesnel Cariboo Observer (B.C.); Seaforth Huron Expositor (Ont.); and the Goderich Signal Star (Ont.). The leader, Carleton Place Canadian, received a mark of 88.5 out of 100.

The Free Press received 12 of a possible 15 points for its front page; 16 out of 20 for its editorial page; eight out of 10 for news of the community; 13 out of 15 for photos; 13 out of 15 for advertising; 13 out of 15 for typography or page design; and eight out of 10 for local features.

tions are only the beginning. Speaking in the government-controlled newspaper Khabar, the Islamic judge who sent the latest victims to their deaths warned: "Before it is too late, the Bahá'ls

must recant ... Otherwise, the day will soon come when the Islamic Nation will, God willing, fulfill the prayer mentioned in the Koran: 'Lord, leave not one single family of infidels on the earth'."

Iran's government, however, must take account of world opinion. Nations as diverse as Zambia, Ireland, Fiji, the United States, Panama, the Netherlands, Australia, Togo. Britain, Ghana and many others have joined in efforts at the United Nations to induce fran to respect the minimal requirements of international law and human decency. Canadians can feel particularly proud of the leadership which our own country has shown in this endeavour.

So far, the pressure of that united opinion has prevented a tragedy of appalling dimensions. Bahá'ís of other races and cultures, in over 130 countries of the world, have joined together to bring the situation in Iran to the attention of mankind. In publishing this statement to our neighbours and friends, the Baha'is of Canada want to express their gratitude to the many humanitarian organizations, women's groups, journalists, leaders of thought. and Canadians of all walks of life who have shown concern and support.

Many of you have asked what you can do to assist. We feel that the most valuable contribution you can make is to express to your Member of Parliament the admiration you feel for the generous and effective efforts Canada has already made and your whole-hearted support for whatever further initiatives are now being considered.


