## Swim rates increase

Starting next year it's going to cost more to swim in Halton Hills. Most pool rental and swim fees are going up. Monday Halton Hills council approved the new rate structure which goes into effect January 1, 1984. The one admission youth charge for a swim will remain at 75 cents, but the adult charge will jump 25 cents to \$1. The family swim remains \$2.25. Cost of lessons are going up. For a 30 minute class the charge will go up from \$12 to \$13.50; from \$18 to \$20 for a 45 minute class; and \$24 to \$28.50 for a 60 minute class. The three month single pass and three month family pass will remain at the current rate of \$18 and \$40 respectively. Annual single and family passes are going down in price. The 12 month single pass will cost \$45 instead of \$54 while the family year long pass will cost \$100 instead of \$116. If you supply your own qualified staff and are renting the pool, the cost will be \$18.25 an hour, it was \$14 an hour. With two Town guards and 1 to 75 swimmers the hourly rental cost climbs from \$24 to \$30 an hour. A crowd of 76 to 150 swimmers can rent the pool and three lifeguards for an hour \$35.60 next year, instead of \$29. For four guards and 151 to 192 swimmers the cost will be \$41.20 an hour, it was \$34. Swim rates haven't increased since September, 1981.
