RECIPE OF THE WEEK

HONEY PEACH PUDDING CAKE

- 5 Ontario peaches, peeled and sliced
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup honey
- 1 egg
- 1 1/2 cups flour
- 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1/2 cup milk
- 2 tbsp. sliced almonds

Combine peaches and 1/2 cup honey; set aside. Cream butter and 1/2 cup honey until smooth. Beat in egg. Add flour, baking powder, salt, vanilla and milk and beat until smooth. Spread into a greased 8-inch square pan. Arrange peach mixture over batter; sprinkle with almonds. Bake at 180°C (350°F) for 55 to 60 minutes or until cake tester inserted in center comes out clean. Serve warm. Makes one 8-inch cake.
