**Police beat**  
**Burglars charged**  
 Halton Police are charging three Acton area youths in connection with a break-and-enter last week at the olde Hide House.  
 A warrant has been issued for one 16-year-old, listed as having no fixed address at the present time. Two others, a 16-year-old Highway 25, Acton resident and a 15-year-old juvenile, have been charged with break-and-enter with intent according to police reports.  
 The offence occurred about 2:50 a.m., Thursday, August 4 when the three youths entered the building by breaking a southside window, causing \$20 damage. They drank four beers which they had found behind the bar counter, then fled when police arrived in response to the building's alarm system.  
 There were two liquor offences over the weekend, police report. An Acton man was arrested at 1:35 a.m. Saturday, and charged with being intoxicated in a public place. Saturday afternoon, a 48-year-old Acton man was also arrested on the First Line, Acton, intoxicated in a public place.  
 Police are investigating a willful damage complaint on Willow St. on Saturday. Between 12 noon and 1 p.m., a small rock was thrown through the rear window of a parked truck, causing about \$100 damage.  
 Early Sunday morning, a similar incident occurred when a beer bottle was thrown at a passing vehicle, resulting in paint chips out of the truck and a cracked rear window. Damage is estimated at \$100.  
 About \$15 in change was taken from the canoe hut in Prospect Park between 10 p.m. Thursday and 8 a.m. Friday, when intruders got into the hut through an unlocked door.  
 Intruders apparently concealed themselves in Acton arena late Friday or early Saturday until after closing hours, and later escaped with \$200 in cash from a pop machine, according to police reports. A fire extinguisher was also taken from the building and used outside the arena, before being tossed into the lake.  
 Intruders broke a rear window to enter a residence on Doby Rd. in Acton sometime last week, Halton Regional Police report.  
 According to police, a radio-cassette player, a portable Walkman radio and three coats were taken from the house in the break-in, for a total of \$1,400 worth of property. The break-in occurred between August 9 and 11, according to police reports.  
 A 24-year-old Arthur St., Acton resident has been charged with being intoxicated in a public place.

 issue erupted. Mason countered this wasn't correct; he knows many Milton residents and they think it's a "hell of a thing" that the billing office for hydro isn't downtown.  
 Pomeroy said he was willing to second the motion, but also willing to see the matter put on hold as long as it was guaranteed the office would remain open in Acton until a final decision is made.  
 He noted his position that there must be some place in town for Acton and area residents to pay their electrical bills is well known. He said there have been discussions between Town and hydro staff, and there will be more talks, about hiring a person to handle electric bill payments at the Town office downtown. Work will have to be found to justify hiring another body, he added; a person can't be employed just to handle bills.  
 Allison noted when the manager's suggested billing office changes were made public in May there was a big controversy. He said he too was willing to second Mason's motion, but preferred to wait for the staff report.
