The fire department plans an exhibit and the mayor and councillors will have a booth where visitors sign a guest book and then will be surprised with a Christmas card from Acton come the Yule season. St. Alban's Church is going to have a booth. You'll be able to sign up to Run for Terry on September 18 at the Market. The fall fair will have a display too.

Businesses outside the market area like the Hide House, Halton Hills Furniture and Appliances, etc., will have booths downtown too.

An antique car display will be another market attraction.

Does the market sound full? Chief organizer Ted Tyler says there's still plenty of room for more. Got something to sell that you didn't see listed above? Then give Ted a call at 853-2040, 1550, 1553, or 0304. Don't

miss out on the crowds and traffic if you've got something to sell.

The cost is reasonable for a booth, just \$1.50 a foot for the frontage of your booth.

It's a good deal, several local individuals not connected with a group have booked space.

But Leathertown Market and Ciderfest is much more than just a shopping spree.

It'll be a weekend full of entertainment and fun too.

Friday night, youths will dance to the sounds of White Summer and PM at the arena. There'll be a light show and soft refreshments available too. All this fun will take place at the arena. Ed Wood is running this event.

Paul Nielsen and Ross Knechtel will be up early Saturday morning, by 7 a.m., to block off the streets for the market.

At 9 a.m. Mayor Peter Pomeroy will fire an antique musket supplied by the Voyageurs Club and declare the market

open.

Then Pete will go to the Band Hall where the parade will be forming up. He'll be riding in an antique car advertising "he's going to the market," follow him. The Citizens' Band will dress up in costumes, but they want lots of company as they head downtown. Residents are invited to dress up and join the parade. Kids can decorate their bikes and ride along.

At around 10.30 a.m. and again about 1 p.m. recording and TV star Kent Tocher will entertain. And local talent like the Sunshine Boys' band will mount the stage downtown and entertain.

There will be some fun events from 11 to noon and beyond under the direction of Kathy Sanford. The mayor and Councillors Bonnette, Whiting and Knechtel have been invited to participate in an apple sauce eating contest. Their hands will be tied behind their backs and members of the audience invited to feed them. Then merchants Larry

Greaves, Paul Nielsen, Ed Wood and Henry Stachyra will be involved in the same competition. There's lots of apple sauce—Mitchell's donated five cases of 48 ounce cans. Children will enjoy an apple bobbing contest, with prizes.

The community garage sale will be held during the market with an auction from roughly 2.30 to 4 p.m. Jack Holmes has volunteered to take the bids. Anyone can bring down anything for sale in the garage sale booth or auction, paying just a small commission.

Want to see Acton and the market from the air? Take a helicopter ride from Prospect Park on Saturday.

Saturday night there will be a dance at the Becker's plaza parking lot for the adults featuring the music of Tim Sky's Big Band Sound.

Sunday will be family fun day at the park. Watch competitive tennis or the ball tournament. There will be a marathon swim by

Nancy Patterson in aid of cancer and the Voyageurs will put on a demonstration. Older folks will enjoy the horse shoe pitching contest at 2 p.m. and a fishing derby, registration at 10 a.m.

Helicopter rides will go on Sunday too. Again you'll be able to wet your whistle at a cider garden, in the rink this time.

Or just enjoy the park and lake in your own way. And don't forget to bring a picnic lunch.

Admission won't be charged, but donations of 50 cents an adult and 25 cents for children will be welcomed at the front gate.

The Citizens' Band will wind up the day with a concert at the band stand.

As Ted says, all they need now is great weather. If the long range forecast is right the weather will be great, clear skies and warm temperatures all weekend long.

Ted wouldn't mind if some more volunteers came forward either.

1/2 tsp. baking powder

Charged with dangerous driving

A 17-year-old Acton resident has been charged with dangerous driving as a result of an early morning accident August 13 on 22 Sideroad.

The youth was driving at a high rate of speed along 22 Sideroad just east of Highway 25 when his car, cresting a hill, became airborne. The driver lost control of the vehicle when it hit the roadway, crossed the centre of the road, struck a tree, bounced off the ground and rolled end-over-end. Damage is estimated at \$3,700.

The driver and four passengers in the car, all Acton area residents, received injuries as a result of the accident, and were taken by ambulance to Georgetown hospital. One passenger, a 20-year-old Acton Blvd. resident, was kept in hospital for a few days for observation as a result of lacerations to the head.

The driver has also been charged with consuming alcohol while under legal drinking age.
