

### Police beat

A 29-year-old Third Line Halton Hills man has been charged with possession of a narcotic (marijuana) for the purpose of trafficking and possession of a restricted drug, Psilocybin (magic mushroom).  
Charges were laid after police executed a search warrant on his property and discovered marijuana plants in the yard and some in the house. Also uncovered was a small amount of Psilocybin.  
A 15-year-old Campbellville youth appeared in Ontario Juvenile Court early last week after he allegedly stole a 1979 Mercury from a garage at an RR 1 Acton residence.  
Halton Police report that the car was stolen from the garage sometime overnight August 25 to 26. The vehicle had been parked in the garage with the keys in the ignition, according to reports. The youth was apprehended in York Region Friday morning.  
Two motorcycle helmets and a pair of motorcycle gloves, all worth about \$430, were taken from L and L Ford-Mercury at 45 Main St. North overnight Thursday to Friday, August 25 and 26, Halton Police report. Thieves smashed a window on the north side of the building and entered the showroom, removing the goods.  
A 47-year-old male was arrested last Wednesday at 5:40 p.m. at Eastern Ave. and Queen St. for being drunk in public.

### CNIB fund wants \$4,000

Because not enough canvassers were available, the annual Canadian National Institute of the Blind (CNIB) campaign will be by mail-ins only, according to chairman Vic Bristow.  
After hundreds of telephone calls, Bristow could only come up with about 50 volunteers to canvass the town, not nearly enough. Instead of adding extra burdens on the few volunteers, he decided to go the mail-in route and hopes it does not severely handicap the campaign.  
While he admits there will probably be a drop in donations, Bristow hopes a \$4,000 goal is not unrealistic. More was raised last year.  
Prepaid envelopes were mailed yesterday (Tuesday) and should be hitting homes today and tomorrow. All the householder has to do is write a cheque and pop it in the mail. Postage will be paid by the CNIB.  
In the meantime, Bristow will personally canvass the industries and businesses in town. The change in format is for residential only.

### Miller fund over \$4,600

Another \$600 has been raised for the Miller family, bringing the total donations to over \$4,600.  
Rev. Gerald Rennie is astonished at the generosity Acton people have shown towards the family which lost a husband and father, Gene Miller, in a fire early last month and which destroyed all their possessions. A second person, 14-year-old Kathy Wears, who was staying overnight with the family, also died in the blaze.  
While monetary donations and furniture are pouring in, the family of four is still seeking accommodations, especially now that school has resumed. A minimum of two bedrooms is needed for the three children and mother. They are currently living with relatives in Speyside.

THE UNTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD has appointed Thursday, the 29th day of September 1983 at the hour of ten o'clock local time in the forenoon at the Halton Hills Administration Building, Council Chambers, Trafalgar Road, for the hearing of all parties interested in supporting or opposing this application.

If you do not attend and are not represented at this hearing, the Board may proceed in your absence and you will not be entitled to any further notice of the proceedings. In the event the decision is reserved, persons taking part in the hearing and wishing a copy of the decision may request a copy from the presiding Board Member or, in writing, from the Board. Such decision will be mailed to you when available.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

**PURPOSE OF THE BY-LAW 82-23**

The purpose of By-law 82-23 is to amend the "Rural" designated permitted uses by removing recreational, picnic areas and parks. It is also the purpose of the By-law to recognize any use, building or structure existing at the date of enactment of By-law 82-23, which exists in accordance with the provisions of the existing By-law 74-51, as amended, Section 8.1, however, enlargements or expansion of a use, building or structure will require municipal approval under Section 43 of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1980.

**EFFECT OF THE BY-LAW**

The effect of the By-law is to recognize all existing legal recreational uses within the "Rural" designated lands in the municipality, and to provide for their orderly and controlled expansion or enlargement. The By-law would also prohibit any future recreational land uses in the "Rural" designated lands without prior approval of the municipality.

**LOCATION OF THE LANDS AFFECTED**

The lands affected by the By-law are of lands designated "Rural" in the existing Zoning By-law 74-51, as amended.
