Moulden in election race

Dolly Moulden of the Fifth Line is in the race for the Ward Two council seat, vacant since the death of Tom Hill.

Moulden, who was defeated in the 1980 election for a seat on regional council, is active in community affairs. She is president of the North Halton Social Planning Council, a member of the board of the Children's Aid Society, vice-chairman of the Halton Housing Authority and a member of Halton Land Division Committee.

Moulden said she would make a policy statement later in the campaign, but noted most of the issues facing council now and in the future affect the rural areas.
