

About \$2,400, including \$515 in cash and an unknown quantity of cheques, was stolen from a residence on Queen St. between 1 and 3 p.m. on Saturday. There was no sign of forced entry and police say the cash box in which the money was sitting may have been left on the porch of the home. The victim was visiting the residence. The money belonged to the Acton Industrial Hockey League.

An 18-year-old Acton man was charged in connection with a house party disturbance on Sunday, September 4, at 6.30 a.m. The man was charged with causing a disturbance and consuming liquor under the age of 19. Though he initially escaped from the scene, he later received a summons.
