Potential disaster averted in apartment fire Sunday
 Volunteer firefighters averted "a potential disaster" early Sunday morning when they confined a major fire to one room of an apartment building.
 Deputy fire chief Bob Hyde estimates \$35,000 damage to a living room at a building at Lot 27, Con. 2 (Mill Street near the First Line), which houses three other apartments.
 Careless smoking is the suspected cause, Hyde says, as the fire began in a chesterfield or chair about 5.30 a.m. The living room was gutted, but the blaze was confined to that one room.
 "The firefighters did an excellent job in confining it. There was a definite potential disaster in there," the deputy chief noted.
 About 8.30 that night, firefighters returned to the apartment building after tenants smelled smoke, Hyde says the furnace must have cut in, sending the odor of smoke throughout the building.
 There were no injuries in either call.
 There is no estimate of damage to a truck which caught fire on Lot 24, Con. 4 of Milton last Tuesday at 11.50 p.m. Deputy Fire Chief Bob Hyde also noted no cause was given.
