

Sabres drop opener 8-3



The Acton Sabres travelled to Streetsville on Friday for their first regular season game dropping the opener against the Derbys 8-3.

The Sabres, playing most of the first period shorthanded, managed to fend off the Streetsville assault until the final minutes of the opening frame.

A spokesman for the team commented, "They played very well even though we were shorthanded on our defense."

Fred Tess, the Sabres starting goalkeeper, played an excellent game stopping 40 shots on goal while faced with several powerplay situations.
