

No more action on festival

Halton Hills is planning to take no action against Farm House Productions for staging a small music festival in the Town without permission on September 17.

The show had been planned for a farm on the north-east side of the Highway 7 and Fifth Line intersection, however Halton Hills obtained a court injunction preventing it from taking place there. The promoters also verbally informed the municipality the show was being cancelled.

However, as crowds were turned away the day of the planned festival at the original site, they were also directed to a property on the First Line just south of Highway 7.

The promoters didn't have proper permission to hold the festival from the estate which own's the Fifth Line site nor the farmers who are renting it.

When the renter of the First Line had discivered his property was being used for a festival and not a small private party as he was led to believe, Halton Regional Police said they were called in. Police allowed the roughly 200 people who were already on the land to remain for the show, but roadblocks were set up on the First Line and about 600 other rock fans turned away.

Tickets for the show were mostly sold outside of Halton Hills and cost \$7. Town staff and police spent over a week investigating the mysterious festival prior to getting to the bottom of the mystery. Details only became clear a few days before the festival.

Continued from Page B1 sent is overshadowed by the public's right to be protected.

In the case of VD, the disease carrier can undergo treatment or face jail. With impaired driving, Dr. Cole suggested that a suspect be required to give a blood sample or face charges, just as those who refuse to provide police with a breath sample.

It is a serious and contentious issue and one that should see a more public debate in Halton when Dr. Cole presents his report to council. But it is something that should be pursued, he said.

Dr. Cole is concerned not only as a doctor, he speaks as someone who has felt the personal cost of impaired driving. Sometime ago a friend and his family were wiped out in a crash involving a drunk driver.

"All I have to do when flagging in my energies is to think of them and my drive to pursue this issue is renewed," he said.

Councillor Dave Whiting said at Friday's Acton councillors' drop-in that municipal

staff plans no futher action. However staff and the legal department are looking at bringing a bylaw regulating

outdoor festivals to council for consideration. Many Ontario municipalities have bylaws regulating festivals and these are used regularly as the basis of obtaining injunctions to prevent such shows when they

don't meet municipal requirements.




