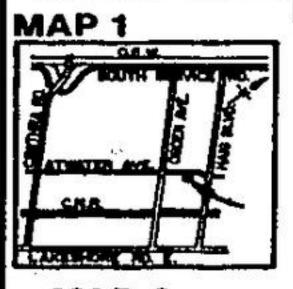
CREDIT VALLEY WATERSHED PLAN OPEN HOUSE

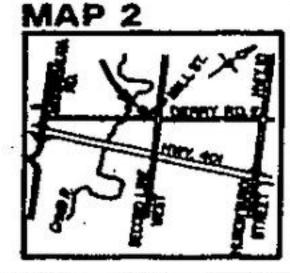

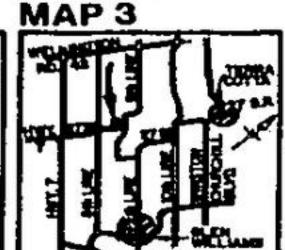


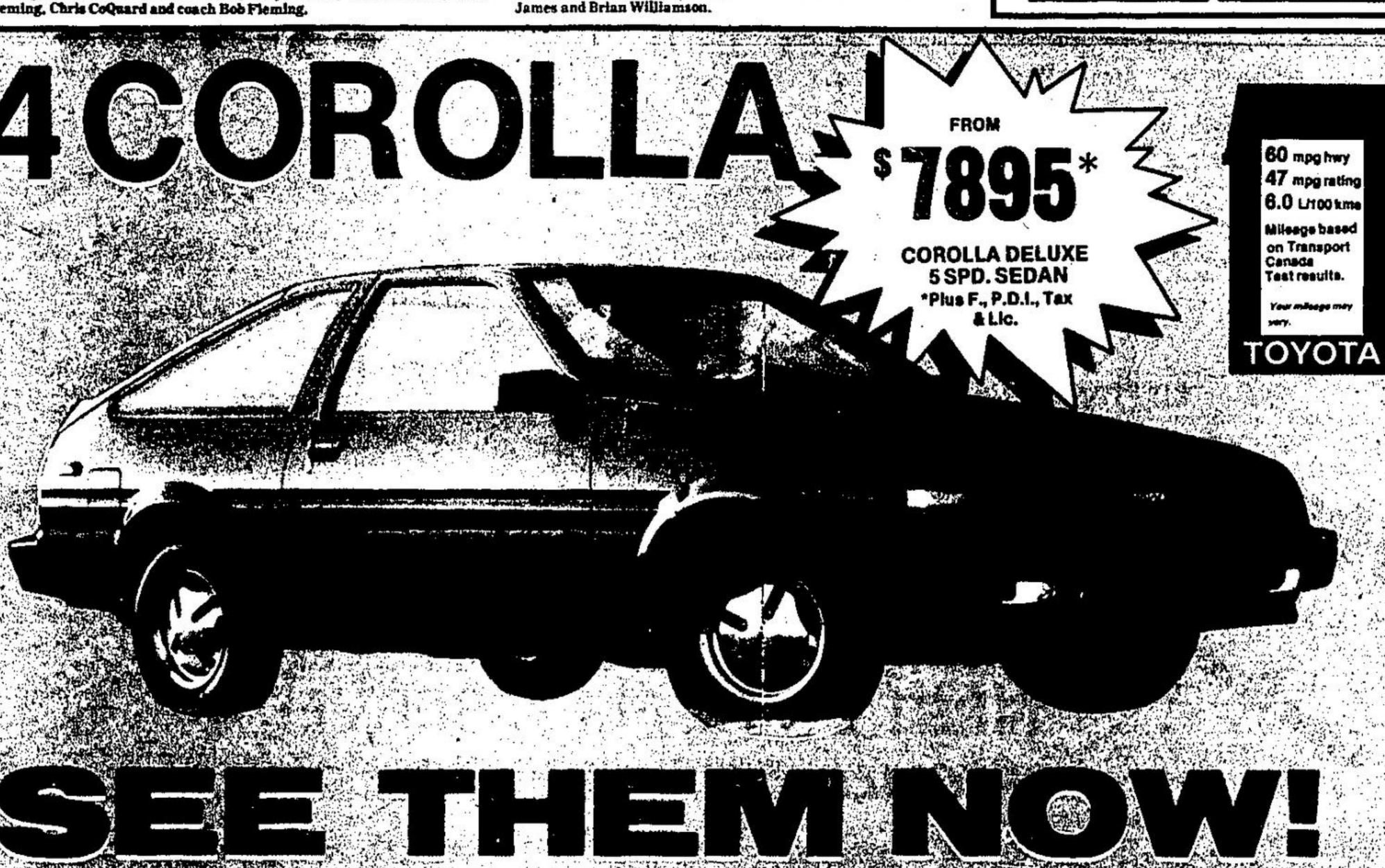
