## Social Service Centre moves, just next door

The Acton Social Services and Information Centre on Mill St. East, has moved to a new location, right next door to their old home.

The centre, which has been at the old Gal's Pal store for over a year, is a relatively new concept in housing social services called a multi-service centre.

According to Peggie Balkind, executive director of the centre, a multi-service centre makes offices available to social and information agencies to work out of.

Balkind said some agencies need offices for only a few weeks out of a year and it would be impractical to give each service and all their fieldworkers their own offices. "Therefore," she continued, "we make offices available for agencies such as Children's Aid, Family Counselling, Legal Clinics and Welfare on a short term basis as they are needed."

"This kind of system works extremely well for us," commented Balkind, "and several other municipalities, such as Milton and Hanover, are looking at the same kind of set up."

Since the agency moved into its previous location a year ago they have experienced 30 percent increase in business—business that means more people are using the services

and more fieldworkers are working out of the Mill St. East offices.

"However," said Balkind, "the new location has both good and bad qualities. We now have much more space, which we needed, but we are less visible from the street."

"The centre is funded mostly by Halton region," said Balkind, "but we also depend on private donations to keep us going."

"Our chairs," explained Balkind, "were donated by local business and private homes and were reupholstered by inmates at the Millhaven Correctional Institute."

The local Agricultural Society also helped out the centre by donating half a pig which was in turn sold for a little extra cash, said Balkind.

The centre has just hired a new part-time staff member, Eileen Dix, who will be helping to run some of the programs at the centre, said Balkind.

The new building has a three and a half year lease, concluded Balkind, and they hope to increase their business further as well as continuing the existing programs.

The centre was originally in the rear of the Y before moving to the old Gal's Pal store; and now to the adjoining house beside the old shop, which is the new home of H and H video.
