Halton Hills will be paying less for road salt this winter than it did last year.

In a memo to General Committee, purchasing agent Hugh Patterson pointed out the low bid for the winter salt from Domtar. Chemicals Limited is \$25.17 per tonne, down from \$25.79 last year. He noted it is expected the Town will use 1,200 tonnes this year.
